# **SUMMARY REPORT**

A review of the feedback received to the Cotman Close Play Area consultation.

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**Note**: When stating percentages in the analysis, we are referring to the percentage of respondents that answered the specific question, rather than the total number of responses to the overall survey. Response percentages may not add up to 100% due to rounding up over .5 and rounding down under .5. Words that appear in italics are quotes taken from comments received. A late response was received via email to the consultation, but it has not been considered nor forms part of this report.



### **METHODOLOGY**

#### **ENGAGEMENT METHODS**

- A leaflet was delivered to 83 properties adjacent to the play area.
- Posters were displayed in the park as well as around the play area to inform regular users.
- The survey was shared with 12 key stakeholders, such as the local town council, ward members and Thameside Primary School.
- The council's Equality Officer shared details of the survey with 9 contacts on the council's access database.
- Targeted social media posts were shared on the Nextdoor app to help promote the consultation.
- The council's Arts Officer worked closely with children from Thameside Primary School to get their views on the playarea.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Vale of White Horse District
Council secured some funding to
replace or revamp the play
equipment in Cotman Close Play
Area. The councils wanted togather
ideas from residents that use the
park or live near it to help shape the
future design of the playarea.

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#### **ABOUT THE SURVEY**

The consultation ran for a fourweek period from Thursday 11
July until 11.59pm on Thursday 8
August. 71 responses were received to the consultation, with 58% being from residents that live in Abingdon and are users of the play area, and a considerable number from residents adjacent to the play area, and a user (27%).



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### **KEY FINDINGS**

71 residents responded to the Cotman Close Play Area survey.



80% feel the condition of the equipment provided is poor (55%) and very poor (25%).



Other pieces of play equipment residents would like to see in the play area are...

- Climbing frame (25%)
- Equipment for toddlers (21%)
- Monkey bars (18%)
- Swings (27%)
- Trampoline (24%)
- Zip wire (14%)
- Slide (15%)

# Are you responding as:

100% of respondents answered this question. Over half of respondents (58%) are residents living in Abingdon and are a user of the play area, followed by residents living adjacent to the play area and are a user (27%).

# If you are responding on behalf of a district, town/parish council, business/organisation or other, what is its name?

Abingdon Town Council provided the name of their council. No other district, town/parish council and business/organisation provided an answer to this question.

# How often do you use the play area?

100% of respondents answered this question. 34% of respondents visit the play area 3-4 times per month, followed by 1-2 times per month (20%). 15% of respondents visit the play area daily.

## Range of play equipment provided

100% of respondents answered this question, 42% of which think the play equipment provided is **poor** (28%) and **very poor** (14%). 41% think the equipment is **average**.

100% of respondents answered this question. 80% think the condition of the play equipment provided is **poor** (55%) and **very poor** (25%).

# Are there any other pieces of play equipment you would like to see in the play area?

91% of respondents answered this question. 79% said they would like to see other pieces of equipment in the play area, whilst 13% answered no.

Of the 79% of respondents that would like to see additional pieces of play equipment in the play area, the most frequently mentioned answers are: swings (27%), climbing frame (25%), trampoline (24%), equipment for toddlers (21%), monkey bars (18%), slide (15%) and a zip wire (14%). 6% of the respondents provided an image of the equipment they would like to see in the play area. The images are provided below.









# If you have any other comments you would like to make about the Cotman Close play area, please provide them below:

39% of respondents provided comments to this question. The most frequently mentioned comments were about the park being used on a regular basis (17%), many say this is due to the park being located adjacent to Thameside Primary School.

15% expressed views around the park needing improvements, a revamp and maintenance, comments included:

- 'This park is used regularly by school leavers and children in the surrounding area so would be lovely to see a drastic improvement in facilities.'
- 'It's a shame the park is so run down and small with it being outside of Thameside school and used daily by the children attending the school you would think it would be more looked after and updated.'





8% feel it would be beneficial to make use of the space, such as by providing goal posts, areas for painting/hopscotch and providing picnic tables. For instance:

- 'add some things as simple as painting a snake for the children to follow along the floor and paint a hop scotch on the floor.'
- 'Picnic tables could be added. Many of the children like to play football so could a goal be added'.

6% would like to see additional seating provided. Comments included:

- 'More seating as there is currently only one bench which is not enough, especially when the park is busy after school.'
- 'Several benches grouped to encourage adults to meet and chat'.






# ENGAGEMENT EVENT FEEDBACK

The following poster was displayed in Cotman Play Area to inform regular users about the survey. Additionally, copies of the poster were delivered to all residents that live adjacent to the play area.




