PARKING PLACES RYE FARM AND HALES MEADOW)(NO.2) ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Vale of White Horse District Council (the Council) proposes to make the above Orders under Sections 32, 33(4) and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act, the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers; with the consent of Oxfordshire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, the effect of which will be to regulate the use of and set the tariff of charges to be made at the Council’s off street car parks.

These Orders contain various provisions concerning enforcement with regard to the operation of the car parks and enforcement in relation to payment of charges and other conditions of use.

The Council proposes:

- a) to revoke the Vale of White Horse District Council (Civil Enforcement Off-Street Parking Places)(No.1) Order 2022;
- b) to revoke the Vale of White Horse District Council (Civil Enforcement Off-Street Parking Places Rye Farm and Hales Meadow)(No.2) Order 2022
- c) to make the Vale of White Horse District Council (Civil Enforcement Off-Street Parking Places)(No.1) Order 2026;
- d) to make the Vale of White Horse District Council (Civil Enforcement Off-Street Parking Places Rye Farm and Hales Meadow)(No.2) Order 2026
- e) to change all Vale of White Horse District Council ‘pay and display’ car parks to ‘pay on arrival’ which will include a move to a ticketless operation without the need to obtain a ticket from the payment machine.

These changes are more particularly described in the draft proposed Orders, which along with a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Orders, will be available for inspection at the Council office at Abbey House, Abbey Close, Abingdon OX14 3JE between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday to Friday (not including bank holidays).
