Charity Collections Policy Survey Comment Form

We are introducing a new joint policy for South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse districts related to charity collections.

The proposed policy is aimed at safeguarding donors and beneficiaries, ensuring fair access to collection opportunities and preventing unlicensed fundraising. It introduces key measures, including:

- A requirement for applicants to provide detailed supporting material about their charity.
- Restrictions on where collections can take place to prevent blanket district-wide collections.
- A minimum of 80 per cent of money donated during house-to-house collections to go to the charitable cause.
- A fairer allocation of dates for street collection.
- Clear grounds for refusing applications and licence revocations.

The policy includes two separate licences: house to house collections and street collections, the survey will distinguish between the two. You will also have the opportunity to comment on the full proposed policy.

What are house to house and street collections?

Street collection – collections of cash on the street for charity, including sale of goods in the street for charity (e.g. bake sale). Does not cover persons collecting direct debit information for future regular donations.

House to House collection – collections made door to door for charitable purposes, including collections of money, 'charity bags' seeking donations of goods, direct debit collections made door to door, etc.

We invite you to share your views on the proposed new policy from **Wednesday 26** February until 11.59pm on **Wednesday 26** March 2025.

What happens next?

Once the consultation has closed, we will review and consider all the comments raised. A consultation summary report of the results will be produced and published on our website. This report will be shared with the Licensing Committees, who will make the final decision to adopt the policy or not.

Any personal information you provide to the councils within your comments that could identify you, will not be published in the summary report.

House to House Collections

This section of the survey is in relation to House to House collections which includes collections made door to door for charitable purposes e.g. collections of money, 'charity bags' seeking donations of goods, direct debit collections made door to door, etc.

We are asking for your views on the key proposed inclusions to the policy below.

A requirement for applicants to provide detailed supporting material about their charity. Proposed policy wording:

All applications must include copies of promotional materials (e.g. leaflets) that are to be used during the collection, along with, where applicable, a copy of any collection bag that will be used for the collection of goods.

Restrictions on where collections can take place to prevent blanket district-wide collections. Proposed policy wording:

Applicants must specify where within the district they wish their collection to take place. Maps defining collection areas, which align with the council ward boundaries. Applications requesting licences covering the whole district will not be accepted, and applicants may apply for a maximum of three collection areas in any single application.

A minimum of 80 per cent of money donated during house-to-house collections to go to the charitable cause. Proposed policy wording:

Each application will be determined on merit, however, at least 80% of the total proceeds of the collection must be given to charitable, benevolent, or philanthropic

purposes. Donors have the right to expect that the vast majority of any money or goods donated shall be used to benefit the named cause, and therefore collections will not be authorised where the applicant does not specify that at least 80% of the gross collection proceeds are given to the charitable, benevolent, or philanthropic purpose. For example, if a clothing collection is carried out and goods to the value of £100 are collected, a minimum of £80 must be given to the charitable, benevolent, or philanthropic purpose specified on the application form.

Set the grounds for which an application may be refused, or a licence revoked. Proposed policy wording:

The council may refuse to issue a licence, or revoke a licence that has been granted, where:

- The amount likely to be applied for charitable purposes as a result of the collection is inadequate in proportion to the value of the proceeds likely to be received
- That remuneration received from the proceeds retained by any person is likely to be excessive
- The applicant or holder of the licence is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence as a result of receiving a conviction for fraud, dishonesty, robbery, burglary, or offences relating to charitable collections
- The applicant or holder of the licence fails to exercise due diligence with regard to collectors to ensure they are suitable persons to be acting as collectors
- The applicant or holder of the licence refuses or neglects to furnish the council with such information as they have been reasonably requested to provide (such as a return form detailing proceeds and deductions relating to a previous collection).

Street Collections

This section of the survey is in relation to Street Collections meaning the collection of money, or the sale of goods, for a charitable cause in any street or public place. This does not include persons collecting direct debit information for future regular donations.

We are asking for your views on the key proposed inclusions to the policy below.

Any one charity/group be allocated a maximum of four collections per year, to provide equal access to all who wish to collect. Proposed policy wording:

To allow for equal access to all who wish to collect, any one charity or group shall only be granted a maximum of four street collection permits per calendar year for each district. Additional applications in excess of four permits granted will be considered on a case by case basis.

Set the grounds for which an application may be refused.

The councils may refuse an application for the following reasons:

- The application does not comply with the provisions of the street collection legislation and regulations
- The collection is considered not to be for charitable purposes
- To limit the number of collections taking place in any one area
- The sum allocated for expenses is considered to be too high
- Inaccurate or inadequate information has been provided on the application form.
- Return forms have not been provided from previously authorised applications.
